TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES January 19th, 2021

The Rockford Town Council held its regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, January 21st, 2021. Members present were Mayor Scott White, Kimberly Crowe, Cordarius Lee, Karen Pemberton, Robert Smith, and Shirley Ogle. Also present were Town Clerk Jennifer Tindall and Police Chief Interviewee Thomas Fuller.

Mayor Scott White called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.

Police Chief Interviewee Thomas Fuller introduced himself and discussed his qualifications, past experiences, and positions held. After questions from council members, shift requirements as well as uniform and gear requirements were discussed. It was stated and agreed upon Thomas Fuller's start pay would be \$16.50 per hour with a .50 cent pay raise after a 90 day probationary period. He then exited the meeting.

Karen Pemberton made a motion to hire Thomas Fuller as full time police chief working no more than 39 hours per week with a starting pay of \$16.50 per hour and a .50 cent pay raise after a 90 probationary period. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

Shirley Ogle made a motion to approve the minutes from the December 15th, 2020, Council meeting. The motion was seconded by Karen Pemberton. All approved, motion carried.

Kimberly Crowe made a motion to approve the financial statements. The motion was seconded by Shirley Ogle. All approved, motion carried.

The old gym roof was discussed. TRV did the job less than a year ago and 40 mile per hour winds ripped up tin that should have been secure if done properly. They also did not complete the job per what was agreed to in the contract. Town Clerk Jennifer Tindall tried to make contact with the owner, Mark McDickinson with voicemails. Mayor White spoke with him outside of Triple R Restaurant. Mayor White let him know his issues and concerns with the job. Mark agreed to meet the Mayor at the old gym to address the concerns and discuss it at a later date and time but he was a no show. Karen Pemberton suggested The Town of Rockford's attorney Derrick Blythe send a certified letter stating the Mayor would like to meet at the school to discuss the damage, why it did not withhold such low winds and why the job was not completed per the contract. If TRV does not reach out, further legal action will be taken.

Mayor White stated Ronnie Joiner came and looked at the roof and estimated it would cost appx \$600.00 to fix the damage caused by the winds. Mayor White instructed him to go ahead and fix it considering it was a very low fair price, the building was uncovered and the more rain we got, the more damage we could get, and the fact we had no other contractors.

The Town's 2010 Dodge Charger was bid out and sold on GOV deals to Michael Posey in the amount of \$1000.00.

The Town's 2001 Crown Vic was sold to an individual, Doug Merkel in the amount \$600.00.

The Town's old Scag Mower was bid out and sold on GOV deals to Russ Lambert in the amount of \$976.25.

These items were approved to be sold by the council in the December 2020 meeting.

The Home Ec building was briefly discussed. It needs major renovations and it is not in the Towns budget. It was suggested by Mayor White to bid out the removal of the building on Gov Deals. Not only will the Town get paid to have it removed but The Town will not be held responsible for the removal or be held liable in anyway. Karen Pemberton suggested any residents with sentimental attachments be given the first opportunity to get any block, rock, or item they may want as a memento. A lot of ideas were tossed around and it was tabled for further discussions.

Mayor White shared a contract and price list for LED Street light upgrades from Alabama Power for the Town. After some discussion, Karen Pemberton made a motion to approve the bid from Alabama Power and move forward with the upgrades. The motion was seconded by Robert Smith. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White discussed the need for a part time maintenance man with Tommy Ayers absence. Karen Pemberton stated the pay should be based on expertise. Robert Smith made a motion to run the ad for a part time maintenance man with specific expertise and pay being determined later based on that experience but not to exceed \$15.00 per hour. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

Jennifer Tindall presented the Council with the 2021 Tax Weather Preparedness resolution to participate in theis years tax free weekend. The Town has participated in the past and they decided to participate again this year. The resolution was unanimously approved and signed.

Robert Smith made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:55 P.M. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

 - Under this Agreement, APC: (i) will provide lighting service ("Lighting Service") and where APC deems necessary, related electric service ("Electric Service") ("Lighting Service" and "Electric Service" shall be collectively referred to as "Service") to Customer for the Selected Components referenced in the Components Exhibit and any additional Components exhibit(s) executed for use for the streetlight areas identified jointly by APC and the Customer under the Rockford Streetlight Service Upgrade (the "Premises"); (ii) may update, modify or replace all poles, bases, wiring, conduit, fixtures, controls and related items (collectively, the "APC Assets") as necessary or convenient in order to address regulatory requirements or for other reasons related to the provision of Service; and (iii) conduct all other APC Activity (defined below).
- 2. Intent and Title. This Agreement concerns the provision of Service to Customer by APC and is not a sale, lease or licensing of goods, equipment, property or assets of any kind. APC retains the sole and exclusive right, title and interest in and to all of the APC Assets utilized in connection with the Service. Moreover, APC may remove the APC Assets upon termination of this Agreement. Customer acknowledges that the APC Assets, even if attached to Customer's real property, always will remain the exclusive personal property of APC and that APC may remove the APC Assets when this Agreement ends. For the avoidance of doubt, Customer's poles (such as Customer's traffic signal poles) are designated as real property as pertaining to this Agreement. Customer authorizes APC, without further consent or action, to file any UCC financing statement or security agreement relating to the APC Assets and agrees that APC may record those documents. APC makes no representation or warranty regarding treatment of this transaction by the Internal Revenue Service or the status of this Agreement under any federal or state tax law. Customer enters into this Agreement in sole reliance upon Customer's own advisors and not on any statements or representations (written or oral) of APC or any of its representatives and agents.
- 3. <u>Term.</u> The initial term for the Agreement shall be for thirty six (36) months, calculated from the date of the first monthly bill (the "Initial Term"). After the Initial Term, this Agreement automatically renews on a month-to-month basis (the "Renewal Term(s)" and collectively with the Initial Term, the "Term") until terminated by either party by providing written notice of intent to terminate to the other party at least thirty (30) days before the desired termination date.
 - The Monthly Service Cost for the Rockford Streetlight Service Upgrade set forth in the attached Components Exhibit and any additional Components Exhibit(s) executed after the Effective Date of this Agreement for the Rockford Streetlight Service Upgrade shall be valid through the Initial Term of the Agreement as noted above. After the Initial Term, APC reserves the right to revise the Monthly Service Cost in the event APC incurs an increase in the cost of ownership or maintenance. APC will provide notice to Customer in accordance with Section 16 prior to any such revision.
- 4. Regulated Cost. During the Term of this Agreement, the actual Regulated Cost will be calculated using the tariffs approved by Alabama Public Service Commission (the "Commission") at the time of billing. Alabama state law and the rules, regulations and applicable rate schedules of APC as may be filed with and regulated by the Commission govern electric service and are incorporated herein by reference. Such laws, rules, regulations and rate schedules are subject to change during the term of this Agreement as provided by law. Copies of current rules, regulations and applicable rate schedules will be provided by APC upon Customer's request and are available for viewing on APC's website http://www.alabamapower.com.
- 5. Payment. APC will invoice Customer for the Service per the terms stated in the Components Exhibit and this Agreement and APC's right to revise the Monthly Service Cost pursuant to Section 3. Customer agrees to pay the monthly amount billed before Customer's next bill is issued by APC. If a balance is outstanding by the next bill date, Customer agrees to pay the greater of 1.5% of the unpaid balance or \$2.00 and acknowledges that APC may require Customer to pay a deposit of up to two times the monthly bill in order to continue service.
- 6. Premises Activity. Customer grants APC and its contractors and representatives the right and license to enter the Premises and perform all manner of activities related to the provision of Service, including the right to: (i) access the Premises with vehicles, the APC Assets and other tools or equipment in order to install and connect the APC Assets and provide Service; (ii) remove and disconnect pre-existing equipment where it is necessary or convenient to do so for the provision of Service; (iii) inspect, maintain, test, replace, repair, and remove APC Assets; (iv) provide electric energy in relation to the Service where APC deems necessary; and (v) conduct any other activities reasonably related to the provision of Service, including surveying, digging and excavation with tools, mechanized equipment and other machinery (activity items (i) (v) collectively, the "APC Activity"). Customer represents that it has the right to permit APC to provide the Service and perform the APC Activity upon the Premises and, where applicable, has obtained the express authority and any required permissions from all Premises owners (and any other party with rights in the Premises) to enter into this Agreement and to authorize the APC Activity and Service.
- 7. Installation. Customer recognizes that APC may be required to install the APC Assets in order to provide this service. Customer represents that: (i) the Premises' final grade will vary no more than 6 inches from the grade existing at the time of Installation; and (ii) if applicable and required for proper Installation, Premises property lines will be clearly marked before Installation.
 - A. <u>Customer Work</u>. If APC, upon Customer's request, allows Customer to itself or through a third party perform any part of the activities related to the installation of APC Assets at the premises (including trenching), Customer warrants that the work will meet APC's installation specifications (which APC will provide to Customer and are incorporated by this reference). Customer is responsible for all reasonable additional costs arising from Customer's non-compliance with APC's specifications or lack of timely (i.e., 10 days') notice to APC that APC Activity related to the installation on APC Assets can commence will allow Customer to perform any part of the Installation (including trenching) subject to the following: (1) Customer provides request to APC; (2) Customer warrants that Customer's work will meet APC's specifications and timing; and (3) Customer acknowledges it is responsible for all reasonable additional costs arising from Customer's non-compliance with APC's specifications or delay.
 - B. Underground Facility/Obstruction Not Subject to Dig Law. Because APC Activity may require excavation not subject to the Alabama's Underground Prevention Legislation (Ala. Code §§ 37-15-1 37-15-11) ("Dig Law"), Customer must mark any private utility or facility (e.g., gas/ water/sewer line; Irrigation facility; low voltage data/communication line) or other underground obstruction at the Premises that is not subject to the Dig Law. If APC causes or incurs damage due to Customer's failure to mark a private facility or obstruction before APC commences Installation, Customer is responsible for all damages and any resulting delay.
 - C. Unforeseen Condition. The estimated charges shown on Components Exhibit include no allowance for any subsurface rock, wetland, underground

stream, buried waste, unsuitable soil, underground obstruction, archeological artifact, burial ground, threatened or endangered species, hazardous substance, etc. not properly marked or identified ("Unforeseen Condition"). If APC encounters an Unforeseen Condition, APC, in its sole discretion, may stop all APC Activity until Customer either remedies the condition or agrees to reimburse all APC costs arising from the condition. Customer is responsible for all costs of APC Asset modification or change requested by Customer or dictated by an Unforeseen Condition or circumstance outside APC's control.

- 8. Verification of Components Installed. Each party will appoint representative(s) (the "Representative") to verify the completion of the Installation. The parties will jointly perform the verification by counting the installed Components (the "Component Count"). The Component Count will be compiled by each parties' Representative(s) based on a mutually agreed upon method. The Component Count will be conducted within thirty (30) days of completion of each of the designated streetlight areas containing at least fifteen (15) upgraded streetlights (the "Grid Area").
 - The parties will appoint additional Representatives as necessary to complete the Component Count. Following agreement by both parties that the Component Count is correct, APC will send electronic notification to the Customer as of the date of the Component Count. APC will update billing following such verification.
 - In the event the Component Count is not completed within thirty (30) days of completion of a Grid Area, billing will be updated based on APC's installation completion count until such time as verification can be completed. Any discrepancies will be mutually resolved and billing will be adjusted accordingly.
- 9. APC Asset Protection and Damage. After Installation and throughout the Term, in the event of any work or digging near the APC Asset, Customer (or any person or entity working on Customer's behalf) must: (i) provide notices and locate requests to Alabama 811; and (ii) provide notices to other utilities or operators as required by the Dig Law. As between Customer and APC, Customer is responsible for all damages arising from failure to comply with applicable law or for damage to the APC Assets caused by anyone other than APC (or an APC contractor or representative
- 10. Interruption of Service. Customer understands Service is provided on an "as is" and "as available" basis and may be interrupted. Customer is responsible for notifying APC if there is a Service interruption. Customer can provide such notice by calling 1-888-430-5787 to report the issue or by reporting the issue online at (http://www.alabamapower.com).
- 11. <u>Disclaimer; Damages</u>. APC makes no covenant, warranty, or representation of any kind (including warranty of fitness for a particular purpose or of merchantability) regarding the Service or any APC Activity. Customer also acknowledges that, due to the unique characteristics of the Premises, Customer's needs, or APC Asset, the Service may not follow IESNA guidelines. "IESNA" shall mean Illuminating Engineering Society of North America. Customer waives any right to consequential, special, indirect, treble, exemplary, incidental, punitive, loss of business reputation, or loss of use (including loss of revenue, profits, or capital costs) damages in connection with the Service, the APC Activity or this Agreement, or arising from damage, hindrance, or delay involving the Service, the APC Activity or this Agreement, whether or not reasonable, foreseeable, contemplated, or (avoidable). Customer is solely responsible for safety of the Premises and agrees that APC has no obligation to ensure the safety of the Premises.
- 12. <u>Vandalism</u>. During the Term, Customer will be responsible for the cost of repairing or replacing any APC Assets damaged or destroyed due to vandalism or willful abuse.
- 13. <u>Liability</u>. To the fullest extent allowed by law, Customer agrees to indemnify, release, hold harmless, and, at APC's request, defend APC and its affiliates and contractors (and their officers, directors, employees, representatives, and agents) from or against any loss, damage, cost, expense, or liability (including actual attorneys' fees reasonably incurred and all expenses of investigation and defense) for any damage or claim for personal or bodily injury (including death), property damage (including loss of use), monetary damage, or equitable relief caused by or arising out of any misrepresentation or act or omission of Customer involving this Agreement, the APC Assets, the APC Activity or the Premises, whether or not caused by or arising out of the joint, concurrent, or contributory (but not sole) negligence of APC.
- 14. <u>Default.</u> Customer is in default if Customer does not pay the entire amount owed within forty-five (45) days of billing. APC's waiver of any past default will not waive any other default. If default occurs, APC, at its discretion, may immediately terminate this Agreement, collect all past due amounts (including late fees) and all amounts due for the Service during the remaining Term, remove the APC Assets from the Premises, and seek any other legal or equitable remedy.
- 15. Immigration Law Compliance. (a) APC represents and warrants that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ, in Alabama, an "unauthorized alien," as defined by the Beason-Hammon Alabama Taxpayer and Citizen Protection Act, §31-13-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, as amended (the "Act"). (b) APC represents and warrants that it will enroll in the E-Verify program prior to performing any work on the project in Alabama and shall provide documentation establishing that APC is enrolled in the E-Verify program. During the performance of this Agreement, APC shall participate in the E-Verify program as required under the terms of the Act and shall verify every employee in Alabama that is required to be verified according to the applicable federal rules and regulations. (c) APC agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of the Act with respect to its subcontractors by entering into an agreement with or by obtaining an affidavit from such subcontractors providing work for APC on the project in Alabama, that such subcontractors are in compliance with the Act with respect to their participation in the E-verify program. APC represents and warrants that APC shall not hire, retain or contract with any subcontractor to work on the project in Alabama which APC knows is not in compliance with the Act. (d) By signing the agreement, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.
- 16. Miscellaneous. This Agreement contains the parties' entire agreement relating to the Service and APC Activity and replaces any prior agreement, written or oral. Subject to applicable law, APC may modify the terms of this Agreement (including the Monthly Service Cost) by providing thirty (30) days' prior written notice to Customer of such modification. If Customer uses the Service or makes any payment to use the Service or or after the effective date of the modification, Customer accepts the modification. Either party may update administrative or contact information (e.g., address, phone, website) at any time by written notice to the other party. Customer will not assign, in whole or in part, this Agreement or its Agreement rights or obligations. Any such assignment without APC's prior written consent will be void and of no effect. In this Agreement, "including" means "including, but not limited to." Alabama law governs this Agreement. If a court rules an Agreement provision unenforceable to any extent, the rest of that provision and all other provisions remain effective.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF ROCKFORD, ALABAMA, TO EXEMPT CERTAIN "COVERED ITEMS" FROM THE MUNICIPAL SALES AND USE TAX DURING THE WEEKEND OF FEBRUARY 26-28, 2021 AS AUTHORIZED BY THE 2021 SEVERE WEATHER PREPARDENESS TAX HOLIDAY RULE 810-6-3.66-.02ER ACT NO. 2012-256

THE CODE OF ALABAMA

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF ROCKFORD, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. In conformity with the provisions a Severe Weather Preparedness Sales Tax holiday Rule 810-6-3.66-.02ER and the Code of Alabama, Act No. 2012-256 enacted by the Alabama Legislature during the 2012 Regular Session, providing for a Severe Weather Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday, the Town of Rockford, Alabama, exempts "covered items" from municipal sales and use tax during the same period, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on Friday, February 26th, 2021 and ending at twelve midnight on the following Sunday February 28th, 2021 and on the last full weekend of February each year thereafter until and unless annual participation is rescinded by further action of the council.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be subject to all terms, conditions, definitions, time periods, and rules as provided by Alabama State Code.

Section 3. Covered Items may be found on the following website of the Alabama Department of Revenue http://www.revenue.alabama.gov/sales-use/sales-tax-holidays

Section 4. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this resolution under the seal of the Town of Rockford, Alabama, and to forward a certified copy to the Alabama Department of Revenue to be recorded and posted on the Department website.

Section 5. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this resolution are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this resolution shall be declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then such ruling shall not affect any other paragraphs and sections, since the same would have been enacted by the municipality council without the incorporation of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 6. This resolution shall become effective after such posting of said resolution as required by law.

If this issue ends up in court with TRV being sued for repair costs, the contractor must agree to be present for the court hearing. No signed statements for court, no I am sorry I have to work, but he must sign a statement agreeing to testify when and if needed no matter what. Ronnie Joiner was present at the meeting and is a licensed contractor. He suggested we call the State License Building board and file a report/complaint. He said they would send someone out to examine the work and write a report stating it was done incorrectly if it was. Jennifer will be contacting them to start the process.

TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES April 20, 2021

The Rockford Town Council held its monthly council meeting on Tuesday, March 20th, 2021. Members present were Kimberly Crowe, Cordarius Lee, and Shirley Ogle. Also present were Mayor Scott White, Town Clerk Jennifer Tindall and Town Attorney Derrick Blythe. Council members not present were Karen Pemberton and Robert Smith.

Mayor Scott White called the meeting to order at 6:05 P.M.

Shirley Ogle made a motion to approve the minutes from the March 16th, 2021, Council meeting. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

Kimberly Crowe made a motion to approve the financial statements. The motion was seconded by Cordarius Lee. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White discussed the need for the Town to obtain a debit card considering there are certain purchases where a debit or credit card is required. He would like to obtain one to limit employee reimbursements. Scott White is the name to be printed on the debit card. Kimberly Crowe made a motion for The Town to obtain a debit card through First bank. The motion was seconded by Shirley Ogle. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White discussed the need for a new account to be set up with First Bank strictly for restoration projects for the cemetery to keep funds separate. Jennifer will transfer funds from the cemetery account donated in the past strictly for restoration purchases to the new account. Jennifer Tindall and Scott White will be signees on the accounts as they are on all other accounts. Shirley Ogle made a motion to create a new Cemetery Restoration account at First Bank. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White mentioned the back to school tax free weekend for the weekend of July 16-18 2021 the town participates in every year. He suggested we amend the resolution to read the town will participate in this every year until otherwise stated. Cordarius Lee made a motion for the town to participate in the back to school tax free weekend and participate every year until otherwise stated. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White discussed the home economics building demolition and removal bids on Gov Deals. He stated the 1st bid was too low so he and the council made the decision to run it again. The 2nd bid of \$2150.00 seemed fair considering the Town would be released of all liability, be required to do no work, and the area be returned to earth only and seeded. This will be done all within 120 days after work begins. Shirley Ogle made a motion to accept the bid of \$2150.00 for the demo and removal of the Home Economics building. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White discussed the need to accept bids for the repair/reroofing of the concession stand portion of the event center. The council agreed to accept bids. An ad will run in the newspaper for this. He also stated the electrical will be restored to the event center April 21, 2021.

Mayor White stated he would like to have a "reopening" ceremony for the senior center at our Town summer event but that the senior center will be open for seniors May 15th, 2021.

Mayor White discussed an issue regarding the public road between the rock house belonging to Mr. and Mrs. Sammons and the courthouse. Mayor White discussed the plants blocking the sidewalk/handicapped parking on the main road (231) and the plants/bushes and rock flower beds impeding on the road between the house and the courthouse. After discussion between Mayor White and Derrick Blythe, Mayor White will be discussing the issue with the courthouse. Matter is tabled at this time.

Mayor White stated Coosa Enterprises, INC submitted a bid regarding removing and repairing the sidewalk in front of the courthouse. Kimberly Crowe asked how they knew to submit a bid if an ad was not ran. Mayor White said the bid was just submitted. Mayor White stated he would like to have more than one bid to compare. Kimberly Crowe made a motion to run an ad in the newspaper to accept bids for the removal and repair of a new sidewalk in front of the courthouse. The motion was seconded by Cordarius Lee. All approved, motion carried.

Jennifer Tindall presented budget proposals to the council regarding new phone systems through Charter. CenturyLink is \$411.00 per month and the council wanted to try and find cheaper. Charter offered 4 lines including phones at 3 yr. \$178 per month and 5yr. \$147.00 per month with a one-time \$1100.00 charge for installation. The chief will not require a line in his office because he requires Wi-Fi. We can obtain a phone with unlimited data through 1st net with unlimited data for \$45.00 per month so the council agreed to obtain his cell phone separately through AT&T. Kimberly Crowe made a motion to obtain new phone service through Charter and to obtain the Chief a cellphone through AT&T. The motion was seconded by Shirley Ogle. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White stated it was time for William Smith's 6 month performance review. Multiple council seats and the Mayor stated he was doing a great job. Mayor White stated he would like to give Mr. Smith a \$1.00 per hour raise. Kimberly Crowe made a motion to give William Smith a \$1.00 per hour raise taking his pay to \$11.00 per hour. The motion was seconded by Cordarius Lee. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White discussed the progression the town was making regarding business licenses. This opened a discussion regarding who was required to have one and who was not. It was suggested by Town attorney Derrick Blythe to maybe come up with a document offering exceptions. For example but not decided on, 15 years and younger or yearly receipts not exceeding \$1000.00 do not require a license moving forward. Derrick stated he would call Jennifer and they would come up with something for approval at the next meeting.

Derrick Blythe presented the council with 2 volumes of animal resolutions. He asked they read over them and approve one of them next meeting.

Kimberly Crowe made a motion to enter into executive session at 6:47 P.M. to discuss maintenance personnel changes. The motion was seconded by Shirley Ogle. All approved, motion carried.

Executive session ended at 6:52 P.M.

Mayor White stated we have applied for multiple grant opportunities. The Town is moving in great directions.

The Mayor stated we received \$18,000.00 ish in funds reimbursed from FEMA for the storm cleanup costs last April 2020 with more to come. We played an instrumental part in how FEMA writes their policies ect. Because of Rockford, 4 other municipalities who were denied have now gotten approved for their reimbursements.

Kimberly Crowe made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:02 P.M. The motion was seconded by Shirley Ogle. All approved, motion carried.

TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES May 18, 2021

The Rockford Town Council held its monthly council meeting on Tuesday, May 18th, 2021. Members present were Kimberly Crowe, Cordarius Lee, Karen Pemberton, Robert Smith and Shirley Ogle. Also present were Mayor Scott White, Town Clerk Jennifer Tindall and Town Attorney Derrick Blythe.

Mayor Scott White called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.

Mayor White suggested hiring part time seasonal summer time help. He said they would work a minimum 10hrs per week with a maximum of 15hrs per week. Shirley Ogle made a motion to hire seasonal summer time help. The motion was seconded by Karen Pemberton. All approved, motion carried.

Interviews were conducted for Benjamin Cardwell, William Jones, and Christopher Jones. They each introduced themselves and spoke a little about themselves. The council asked questions such as residence and experience.

Kimberly Crowe made a motion to approve the minutes from the April 20th, 2021, Council meeting. The motion was seconded by Shirley Ogle. All approved, motion carried.

Shirley Ogle made a motion to approve the financial statements. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White discussed putting the 2001 Crown Vic on Gov Deals. He stated we had 2 reliable police cars and in the future may be applying for a grant to obtain another newer one. He stated we should put the 2001 Crown Vic on Gov Deals while we can still get something for it. Karen Pemberton made a motion for The Town to put the 2001 Crown Vic on Gov Deals. The motion was seconded by Cordarius Lee. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White discussed the Town Tractor situation. He stated the need for a bigger tractor to keep up with required maintenance. The Towns currently owned tractor, John Deere, received the highest bid on Gov Deals of \$11,300. He received 3 quotes on other tractors. The quotes included a Kubota for \$28,346.40, a Mahindra for \$27,900.00 from Peach Auto and Outdoor, and a John Deere for \$32,150.00. The council discussed purchasing the Mahindra. The profits from the sale of the John Deere the Town currently owns in the amount of \$11,300.00 will offset the price of the Mahindra bringing the total price to \$16,600.00. Mayor White had Peach Auto and Outdoor bring the tractor to the meeting for the Council to inspect. Karen Pemberton made a motion for the Council to inspect the Mahindra and if all agreed, approve the sale of the Towns John Deere for \$11,300.00 and approve the purchase of the Mahindra for \$27,900.00. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried. (The Council later unanimously agreed on the sale and purchase after inspecting the Mahindra)

Mayor White stated Alabama Power will be starting the install/upgrades of the new LED street lights the following day, May 19th, 2021.

The Senior Center was first expected to reopen on May 15th but was delayed due to ongoing construction. It is now expected to open within a week or two.

Discussion was had regarding VOL 1 and VOL 2 of the animal resolutions Town attorney Derrick Blythe prepared and presented at April's Council meeting. Karen Pemberton suggested changing the verbiage Town Finance Department to simply state Town Clerk. TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES June 15, 2021

The Rockford Town Council held its monthly council meeting on Tuesday, June 15th, 2021. Members present were Kimberly Crowe, Cordarius Lee, Karen Pemberton, Robert Smith and Shirley Ogle. Also present were Mayor Scott White, Town Clerk Jennifer Tindall, Town Attorney Derrick Blythe, Police Chief Jamie Hammond, and Maintenance personnel Bill Smith.

Mayor Scott White called the meeting to order at 6:01 P.M.

Karen Pemberton made a motion to approve the minutes from the May 18th, 2021, Council meeting. The motion was seconded by Shirley Ogle. All approved, motion carried.

After some discussion, Kimberly Crowe made a motion to approve the financial statements. The motion was seconded by Cordarius Lee. All approved, motion carried.

Jennifer Tindall gave an update on the new phone system through Charter. July 6th-9th install new cables/wires, July 13th install modem and switch, July 15th training on new phones/system, July 20th go live(No phones starting at 9 AM lasting appx 15 mins)

Mayor White discussed the idea of The Town of Rockford adopting their own court system opposed to operating through the County. He discussed details such as how much we get per ticket now versus how much we could get if we adopted our own system. Chief Hammond briefly discussed aspects as well. Mayor White stated he had previously met with the mayor of Jackson's Gap to get more information and stated he had a meeting the next day, June 16th, 2021, in Montgomery to get more information. Derrick Blythe weighed in with his knowledge on the matter and stated specifics such as the benefits of going with delayed prosecution program opposed to not. It will be discussed again after those meetings.

Mayor White discussed an update on the senior center. As far as work, the project is almost complete. Mayor White provided each council person with a letter sent to him from the County Commission. The letter states they would like a meeting with the Mayor, the project engineer, and the project contractor to discuss project deficiencies before the project is complete. Mayor White discussed the deficiencies the commission was referring to and explained how they were not deficiencies. Some issues had not been addressed yet considering the project is not complete such as the doors. Karen Pemberton stated she would like the council made aware of when the meeting would take place so they could be present.

Mayor White stated the Flower pots located at Mr. Roger Sammons' residence were previously moved from obstructing the sidewalk but placed back. It was said Mr. Sammons placed his flower pots back on the side walk after The state Dept. told him "they didn't care where he put his pots" but that was hear say. Mayor White read the council ordinance #27 which states a residence or business cannot obstruct any part of the sidewalk with their trash, filth, or other property of private nature. Derrick Blythe stated we were within our legal rights and covered by this ordinance to legally remove the pots from the sidewalk at the owner's expense regardless of what the State said. The council stated to not throw the pots away if it came to that but store them in the garage until further notice. Mayor White stated he would take care of this within the week.

Mayor White gave an update on the LED lights. They are currently working their way through town installing them. Mayor White said The Town was paying \$33 per month for the lights behind town hall and we were only supposed to be paying \$10.00 per month. This will somehow offset the cost of the below new light cost. He stated there were multiple break-ins at the event center and he feels the fact it is not very well lit plays a part in that. He also stated we will be doing future events and the senior center would soon be open so it really should be more lit. He suggested Alabama Power install a 1000 watt light at the event center for \$70.00 per month but that price will be partially offset due to the overpayment of the other lights. Karen Pemberton made a motion to have Alabama Power install a 1000 watt light at the event center. The motion was seconded by Robert Smith. All approved, motion carried.

Mayor White stated our beautification day was this Saturday June 19th from 8-1 and asked if The Town could buy flower bed supplies from the General Fund in the amount of \$1200.00 but the General Fund would be reimbursed when the project was complete and the grant was paid out. Karen Pemberton made a motion to purchase the flower bed supplies in the amount of \$1200.00. The motion was seconded by Shirley Ogle. All approved, motion carried.

Cordarius Lee made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:43 P.M. The motion was seconded by Kimberly Crowe. All approved, motion carried.

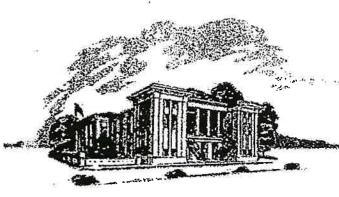
